

Become a Junior Rapporteur at the World Water Week in Stockholm 2010!

The Swedish Water House and Stockholm International Water Institute are looking to engage Master Students, PhD Students, or young professionals based in Sweden that have a special interest and expertise in one or several of the subjects discussed at the World Water Week in Stockholm.

World Water Week (WWW) is an annual event organised by Stockholm International Water Institute (SIWI) and attracts approximately 2 500 participants from over 135 countries and more than 200 organisations working with water and development. This year's theme is "*Responding to Global Changes: Prevention, Wise Use and Abatement*" with Special Focus on Water Quality.

As a Junior Rapporteur you will be an instrumental part of the Reporting and Conclusion Process. Together with an experienced Lead Rapporteur the Junior Rapporteurs will follow pre-identified themes during the week in order to capture, summarize and analyse the discussion in relation to the overall aim of the week. Please note that the pre-identified themes are still being developed. The aim is for the rapporteurs to present their findings and reflections at the Closing Plenary Session on Friday 10 September and to write a report that will be published in the Overall Conclusions of the WWW 2010.

The engagement does not include any reimbursement, but the successful candidates will receive free registration to the conference, lunches and social events. Working at the World Water Week will give you great opportunities to network and develop your analytical skills under professional guidance. It is vital to note that this is an important and time consuming assignment. The rapporteurs will be given Terms of Reference, with a number of questions and issues to keep in mind as they follow workshops, seminars and side events in their respective and related areas.

If you are qualified and interested in water and development, and if you want to be a 2010 Junior Rapporteur, please send your application to Ann-Mari Karlsson (see contact details below). The application must include a CV and a personal letter, which should include a motivation statement on why you would be a strong candidate and state your areas of interest, as specifically as you can. The selected candidates will then be designated a Lead Rapporteur within an appropriate theme to work with during the week.

Completed applications must be received by 10 May, 2010.
